
This year our golf committee elected to dedicate proceeds from the helicopter drop, marshmallow drive, mulligans, and split the pot raffle to the CSI Chicago's

# The Closeout Conrad Chicago

Epstein was the architect of record as well as civil, MEP/FP, and structural engineer working with a team of designers which included Pierre-Yves Rochon and the Puccini Group on Gellar Investment Company's office-to-hotel redevelopment of Chicago's 101 East Erie. In this role Epstein helped the Gellar Investment Company convert the upper 13 floors of the commercial office building at 101 East Erie into a five-star luxury hotel under the Conrad By Hilton flag.



101 E. Erie, commonly known as the Draft FCB building, was built in the mid 1980's as a Class A office building

and is comprised of two separately-owned sections. The lower seven floors are owned and occupied by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Chicago and floors 8-20 were owned by Lexington Realty Trust and were occupied by Draft FCB, a prominent advertising, branding, and strategic planning firm.

Epstein's designers and engineers coordinated the lobby design, guest rooms and public spaces created by Pierre-Yves Rochon while Epstein designed all of Hilton's Operational Spaces under the Conrad flag and brand standards. The Conrad Chicago program included a 289 key hotel with public spaces on the ground floor and levels 8-20. Hotel operational functions occupied the 2nd basement level. Multiple food and beverage venues were developed by the Puccini Group. Typical guest rooms are located on levels 8-18 with a fitness center on level 8. Meeting rooms occupied level 19. Level 20 was conceived as an amenity level with Hotel check-in, Bar/ Lounge, and kitchen supporting a 3-meal signature restaurant.
