



This award recognizes a CSI member, chapter, region or group for outstanding effort in the communication of CSI related topics and activities.






Hot Tip of the Month Provided by Mario Gonçalves

Large Files Can Be A Pain To Transfer - Not Any More

Sometimes, you may need to send very large files to someone, but perhaps your regular e-mail account can't accommodate such large file sizes. That's where cloud storage services can help. But instead of using a service like DropBox or Google Drive — which requires you to log in, upload the file, and then share the file — you can take the quick, no-frills route of using WeTransfer.



WeTransfer is file sharing at its simplest. It works as if your e-mail account can support those large file sizes — you type in your e-mail address and the recipient's e-mail address, add a message, attach the file, and send. That's it. For the basic (and free) WeTransfer service, you don't need to set up an account. You can transfer files as large as 2GB, which should be enough capacity to send a bunch of high-resolution photos, a few decent-sized videos, just about anything. The recipient gets an e-mail with a link to download the file, and — voila! — you just sent a huge file that otherwise would have choked your e-mail service provider.



Evaluating the Field Performance of Windows and Curtain Walls of Large Buildings

The most common and costly problems associated with the in-service performance of the vertical building envelope of large buildings are related primarily with excessive air leakage and water intrusion. In particular, windows and curtain walls, as well as their interface with the adjacent wall construction, are determining elements in the performance of the vertical building envelope. Improved standards and design principles have contributed in significantly improving the performance of window and curtain wall systems, whether it is with respect to resistance to water penetration, air leakage resistance, wind load resistance or condensation resistance. The reality, however, is that many buildings of recent construction are still experiencing problems with the in-service performance of installed window and curtain wall systems. Typically, these problems are often the result of poor installation, fabrication and lack of adequate quality control.

This paper focuses on evaluating the field performance of windows and curtain walls of large buildings 1) during the early stages of construction to validate as-built design and 2) during later construction stages as a quality control measure. Large scale field testing to assess building envelope performance in large buildings will be demonstrated through several practical case study examples.

The primary objective of this paper will be to provide an increased level of knowledge to the building community for an improved awareness of the benefits and limitations of the use of field testing in evaluating the field performance of the vertical building envelope of large buildings.
