## Chapter Meeting: Tuesday, Nov. 27, 2018 Alchemy of Architecture

There was a lot of great chemistry at this month's Chapter Meeting. The 70+ attendees were compatible with both the announced Rebuilding Together Fundraiser and our guest speaker Dave Kimball from PROSOCO.

We kicked off the night with an exciting announcement that in honor of Giving Tuesday, CSI Chicago would match up to \$1,000 donated that night to our 2019 Rebuilding Together Initiative. The Rebuilding Together Fundraiser was followed up by a "Alchemy of Architecture" presentation by Dave Kimball from PROSOCO. Dave's presentation style was very collaborative which lead to great discussions amongst the crowd about the chemistry of a number of products and solutions.

Dave's presentation covered the following learning objectives:

- Become familiar with typical architectural materials and chemistries currently available on the market.
- Understand what compatibility is and what common materials you should be careful with.
- Review common details where differing products/ assemblies must interface.
- Understand the importance of sequencing related to material chemistry.







## 2018 Illinois Energy Conservation Code Preview: Residential Buildings

This is the last post in our three-part series on the upcoming adoption of the 2018 Illinois Energy Conservation Code (Illinois Energy Code) based on the 2018 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC). In two prior posts, we discussed the history of the Illinois Energy Code, some of the differences between the current version of the IECC and the 2018 edition, and the changes to the IECC's commercial building provisions. This post details some of the revisions to the IECC's residential building provisions that are likely to impact the Illinois Energy Code.



Residential buildings that contain more than three stories in height above grade must follow the IECC's chapters governing commercial construction despite the existence of the IECC residential building provisions. Also, care should be taken when dealing with any residential one-and-two-family dwellings and townhouses with three or fewer floors because these may also be regulated by a local jurisdiction that has adopted an earlier version (2015 and earlier) of the International Residential Code (IRC). The energy conservation provisions contained in the IRC may not align with the upcoming state code (Illinois does not adopt the IRC as a state code).

The following highlights the changes to the IECC's residential building requirements to increase or protect energy efficiency and may impact the Illinois Energy Code.

# The Closeout DePaul University School of Music

Music Center is the first phase of a new facility for the DePaul University School of Music. The new structure anchors the updated complex, sitting on the site once occupied by McGaw Hall. It houses several performance spaces including a 535-seat concert hall, a 136-seat large recital hall, and an 80-seat small recital hall. The main entrance to the building is located adjacent to a circular motor court, which allows for efficient passenger dropoff and provides access to lower level parking. Student rehearsal rooms, practice rooms, and classrooms are strategically organized on the upper floors by the required functional and acoustic adjacencies relative to the double and triple height performance spaces rising from the floors below. Music Center's facade complements its surroundings and is composed mainly of brick with limestone panels and horizontal coursing as detail elements. Glass and natural stone, used throughout the exterior, are arranged to moderate the building's mass and present a lively atmosphere along Halsted Street. The building height is reduced at the edges through setbacks in the main volume to mediate between the required Concert Hall height and the surrounding residences. The new School of Music complex functions as a gateway and redefines the eastern edge


