



## I have my CDT – what's next?

Depending on your role on the project team, you can enhance your job skills by studying for the **Certified Construction Specifier (CCS)**, **Certified Construction Contract Administrator (CCCA)** or the **Certified Construction Product Representative (CCPR)** certifications. You can hold more than one advanced certification.

- The CCCA helps you develop, administer, and enforce construction documentation. People who pass the CCCA have proven their knowledge regarding quality assurance and quality control, bidding and negotiating procedures, enforcement and liability and MasterFormat's® Division 01.
- Getting your CCPR increases your effectiveness in making sales calls, presentations and being at product shows. How you communicate with the design and contractor teams will directly impact your success. The information contained in the CCPR curriculum helps you speak the same language as the design and contractor team.

- If you pursue the CCS, you'll improve your ability to investigate and identify cost-effective, efficient solutions and then communicate those solutions through specifications. You'll be able to use spec-writing software more effectively.
