


Last Call for Special Reinstatement Certification Program October 15, 2018: Reinstatement period ends

Chapter News Event Recap

Chapter Meeting: Tuesday, September 25, 2018 Buildings as Product: Exploring the Benefits of Factory-Manufactured Buildings for the 21st Century

Skender graciously hosted 105 attendees to kick off CSI Chicago's fall chapter meetings with a riveting presentation from Skender's Chief Design Officer, Tim Swanson, on "Buildings as Products."

Over the course of an hour, Tim walked us through the precision assembly processes of automobile and other

manufacturing sectors that could potentially translate into the construction industry. Below are the key takeaways that Patrick Reicher of Raths, Raths, and Johnson took from the presentation:

- Construction technology and processes have been stagnate for the past 25 years. During that time, automated assembly processes have permeated the manufacturing sector and offer endless possibilities to improve construction methodologies.
- There is great potential for significant productivity improvement in construction. While constructionrelated spending accounts for 13 percent of the world's gross domestic product (GPD), the sector's annual productivity growth hovers around 1 percent per year.
- While understanding that construction sites have extraordinarily complex coordination and scheduling challenges, many site-related issues may be overcome by constructing significant portions of buildings faster and better in a controlled factory environment.
- There have been documented issues with modular manufacturing and construction technologies in the past. However, as design methodologies and understanding of assembly tolerances continue to improve, interest in the use of modular construction continues to grow.

This program was featured as part of CSI Chicago's annual Contractor Engagement Month. Thanks to the outreach efforts of the Contractor Engagement Committee, we were thrilled to welcome the 20 contractors registered to take part in our program.







Looking Ahead to the 2018 Illinois Energy Conservation Code By: Christopher E. Chwedyk, CSI, AIA

Illinois is in the process adopting the 2018 Illinois Energy Conservation Code (Illinois Energy Code). As required by state law, Illinois must adopt amendments to the Illinois Energy Code based on the latest version of the International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), a model code that is updated on a three-year cycle. The new version of the Illinois Energy Code will be based on the 2018 IECC. Over three posts, we will preview some of the changes we are likely to see in the 2018 Illinois Energy Code.

The state has made considerable progress in mandating buildings' energy efficiency over the last 15 years. In 2002,

only 25 percent of local Illinois jurisdictions had some building energy code provisions. Chicago took the lead by adding a whole new chapter (18-13) to their building code in 2003, a modified version of the 2000 IECC, then in its second edition. However, the only means of enforcement was to require certification by Registered Energy Professionals (REP), licensed engineers or architects who attended special training classes. That same year, Illinois adopted the latest ASHRAE 90.1 standard as part of the Illinois Capital Development Board (CDB) Act (20 ILCS 3105), that was only applicable to state-funded construction. <u>Read full post on *The Final Review*</u>.

The Closeout 8 East Huron

In 2012, CA Ventures began to develop a luxury residential project on the edge of the River North neighborhood of Chicago. The clients envisioned a sleek glass building with boutique units and amenities worthy of the modern idea of luxury. During the early stages of design, other architects had struggled to fit the intended program on such a small footprint. Valerio Dewalt Train was consequently brought on to solve the complexities of the site and to achieve the client's goals within the existing parameters.

As seen from the street, the completed 26-story residential tower is wrapped in glazing with accents of white Ceramitex sintered paneling. Protruding rows of balconies are semi-enclosed by the window wall, which continues above the roofline and is architecturally expressed on the amenity level. To achieve its sleek aesthetic, the concrete structure is tucked behind the glass, and all lateral members are placed in a hidden level below the pool among the building's mechanical systems.

At ground level, the building has two commercial spaces that face State St and Huron St. Through the lobby entrance on Huron, residents are greeted by concierge that sit among polished Calacatta marble and custom millwork. The 101 rentable units in the

building consist of studios, as well as 1, 2 & 3 bedroom units designed with high end finishes and floor to ceiling windows that provide breathtaking views of the city.
