When Dan joined Häfele almost six years ago, he was happy that the company was supporting CSI Chicago by hosting many events in their downtown showroom, but thought that there was not enough engagement and participation in the local Chapter. Dan says that he has thoroughly enjoyed changing that situation by joining and becoming active in two CSI chapters. The biggest benefit in joining CSI for Dan has been the warm and interesting people he has met, along with the perspective that it has helped him gain. Dan's tip for others is that YouTube is a great tool for sending short product presentation videos. He also utilizes Google Earth to look at a building or a customer location.

Dan's advice to young AEC professionals is to embrace a learning mindset and find a way to mingle with people who have a lot of experience. He says there is no limit on how much you can learn from others. Dan recommends developing the ability to ask open ended questions and be a good listener, then just enjoy the ride!



All drawers throughout the display are the sleekly styled Grass Vionaro Drawer System in graphite finish.
