President's Letter



Dear Friends,

I've decided to make this month my CDT love letter; but first:

It was so good to see all of you at the September meeting! I especially enjoyed the new member reception and meeting the newest members of

the chapter while enjoying a beautiful September evening alongside the Chicago River. My special thanks to Bob Moretti and the membership committee for organizing, and to the event sponsors, <u>Lotte Advanced Materials</u> and <u>GCP Applied Technologies</u> for their support of the special reception.

As I mentioned during the meeting, in September Elias Saltz, chapter treasurer and former president, returned from CONSTRUCT with three new awards for the chapter mantle. But what I didn't mention was that two of our chapter members, Andrea Baird and Corey Zussman, were presenters for the continuing education portion of CONSTRUCT. It brings me a lot of pride to know that the Chicago chapter was so strongly represented in Providence. Kudos and thanks to all!

And now for my CDT story:

I earned my CDT seven-and-a-half years ago with little fanfare. I was in the midst of my architecture licensing exams and had not yet joined, or even given a thought to joining CSI. I can't recall how I heard about CDT initially though it was likely during my exhaustive search for study materials for the construction documents portion of the licensing exams. I likely stumbled upon CDT study resources and the line of thinking that followed was, "Hey, I can study the same material for two exams – why not?" I ended up passing both exams, my interest in CSI was piqued, AND I began taking a long, hard look at the role that specifications play in contract documents.

You see, for the 3 years prior I had been learning construction contract administration the "hard" way: via a flurry of RFI's, rushed submittal reviews, plentiful change order proposals, hurried ASI's, and more than one awkward OAC meeting. Specifications had gone from being a thorn in my side to my saving grace (and back) on more than one occasion. I quickly recognized that in order to fully unlock the power of contract documents I had to master drawings, specifications, and how they worked together with the contract agreement. CDT was my wake-up call, and the rest, as they say, is history. Soon after I decided to pursue the role of specification writer, joined CSI to build knowledge-sharing relationships with some of the construction industry's finest technical minds, and continued to broaden my knowledge by earning more credentials through CSI.



What You missed at CONSTRUCT 2017 in Providence By: Lauren Anderson, CSI, CDT

I am not even sure where to begin recapping CONSTRUCT 2017.

What I will start with is my experience from last year in Austin, Texas, as I had never attended a conference for my job until that CONSTRUCT. As a product rep, this conference is the only one specifically tailored toward my profession within the AEC industry. As I was concerned about keeping costs down in '16, I registered as a Young Professional, and chose not to add on the Welcome Reception or walking tour. Fear drove my decision making as I didn't know very many people attending at all. Instead of taking advantage of this opportunity, I squandered it by skipping the afternoon sessions of Young Professionals (YP) Day, the Welcome Reception, CSI Night Out and the YP mixer. 

The Closeout The Robey & The Robey Hall

Together, The Robey and The Robey Hall historic restoration project brings 89 modern hotel rooms to the heart of the Wicker Park/Bucktown neighborhood. This complex project opened at the close of 2016 and combines two historic buildings with a third, one-story building to create a new landmark facility, anchored at Damen, North and Milwaukee Avenues.

Each historic building renovation has a distinct aesthetic which creatively interprets the original building functions both inside and out. The Robey, formerly The Northwest Tower was designed by Perkins, Chatten and Hammond and built in 1929 as the first high-rise outside of downtown Chicago. The renovation of The Robey was focused on restoring the historic art deco skyscraper, keeping the original details and materials wherever possible. The dominant feature of The Robey's lobby is the original dark green marble, terra cotta floors and bronze elevator doors. A revolving wood door facing Milwaukee Avenue was restored by its original, Indiana-based manufacturer. Elsewhere, the boutique hotel nods to the building's history and the result highlights the trim, vertical Art Deco style with a warm and quirky effect amplified by unique details like bas-relief sculptures of swans on the exterior and a topside cupola. The exterior restoration repaired the building's spandrels and buckling brick, buffed limestone panels, inserted new aluminum-clad windows to replicate the historic profiles and brought back glass to the boarded-up cupola.

At The Robey Hall, a roll-up garage door once used for truck deliveries to the former manufacturing facility now welcomes guests to a 20-room upscale hostel with a modern, glassy lobby entrance. The restoration was careful to retain the grit and grace of the original building. The neo-classical, terra cotta facade along the Milwaukee Avenue sidewalk and the building's original concrete floors were carefully restored and the original concrete ceilings remain exposed throughout. The Robey Hall also received a new roof structure and the addition of a rooftop restaurant and pool.
